











































STATEMENT OF PURPOSE - STUDENT VERSION





 St Catherine's is a  national  charity which is  approved by the  Department for  Education.

The  school has  three  terms a  year.  Residential  placements are  weekly  boarding,  term  time  only ( Sunday  evening to  Friday  afternoon).

 St Catherine's is in  Ventnor, a  small  seaside  town on the  Isle of  Wight. The  location and  supportive  community are  key

to the  success of the  school, as it  gives  our  students  opportunities to  develop  their  independence and  life skills. The

 school buildings include  four  residential  houses.  Students are in

 houses  appropriate for  their  age.



Education



Each student has their own programme, allowing individual needs



to be met within a modified learning environment.

therefore, a significant amount of time is devoted to them.







Sixth Form College Curriculum



The College's aim is for young people to make continued







progress in education and functional communication skills in order

Care

The residential care team at  St Catherine's provide much more  than a  welcoming and  comfortable place to stay, they support  students to further  develop their  life and  independence  skills.

Each area of independence is broken up into small stages and  in total there are around  500  steps that  students can  cover  if they  complete the  entire  programme.

Therapy

The  therapy  department consists of  speech and language therapists  and  therapy assistants,  occupational therapists and  therapy

assistants, a dance movement psychotherapist, an art

psychotherapist and our therapy dog, Dougal.

The therapy team is an integral part of St Catherine's - working

throughout the school, sixth form college and within the residential

houses.
