Things to do:

St. Catherine's is located in Ventnor on the Southern tip of the Island. Ventnor has been compared to Notting Hill and is a popular destination, appealing to a variety of visitors including celebrities.

The beach and esplanade wind upwards to the town that offers an eclectic mix of vintage shops and antique stores, as well as those offering all the essentials.

Ventnor Fringe (every year) has become a centre point of Ventnor's season, showcasing a unique celebration of the arts, with emerging and established talents across all creative disciplines from comedy to theatre, music and dance.

The Island is home to the oldest carnivals in the UK and these are a focal point of the summer in our seaside towns along with the world famous Cowes Week and the Isle of Wight Festival.

The Isle of Wight has miles of stunning countryside, award winning beaches and a wealth of history and heritage. The Island is 22 miles across so you are never far away from the beach, you can opt for bustling seaside towns or calm and secluded beaches and coves away from it all. The island is an area of outstanding natural beauty and for those who prefer the countryside there are walks, cycle tracks, forests and downland and a huge variety of outdoor activities.

Living on the Island

Buying or renting a property on the Island can be more affordable than many areas in the South of England. The average house price for the Isle of Wight is £310,000, with the majority of sales in the region of £225 - 280,000 for semi detached and terraced houses. Rental prices start from around £650 per month.
