Staff CPD has upskilled staff, leaving a lasting impact on how the gym is used to support physical and emotional wellbeing.

Sensory adaptations to the PE hall are permanent, ensuring long-term accessibility for current and future cohorts.

Adaptive equipment will continue to be used, embedding inclusive practice into daily PE provision.

Safety resources (hi-vis jackets) support safe participation in whole-school events in future years.

Internal sports competitions and certificates have created a culture of recognition and participation that will continue beyond this year.
